**A single quaver** = half a beat.

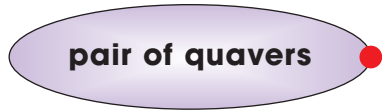
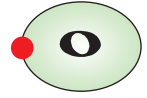
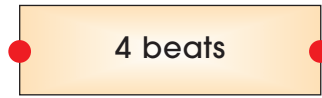
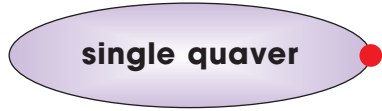
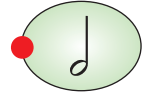
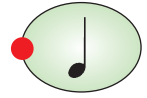
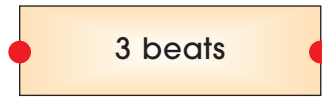
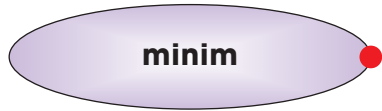
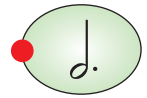
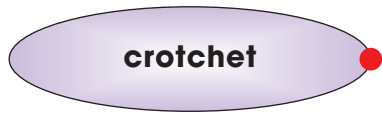

At an easy walking pace

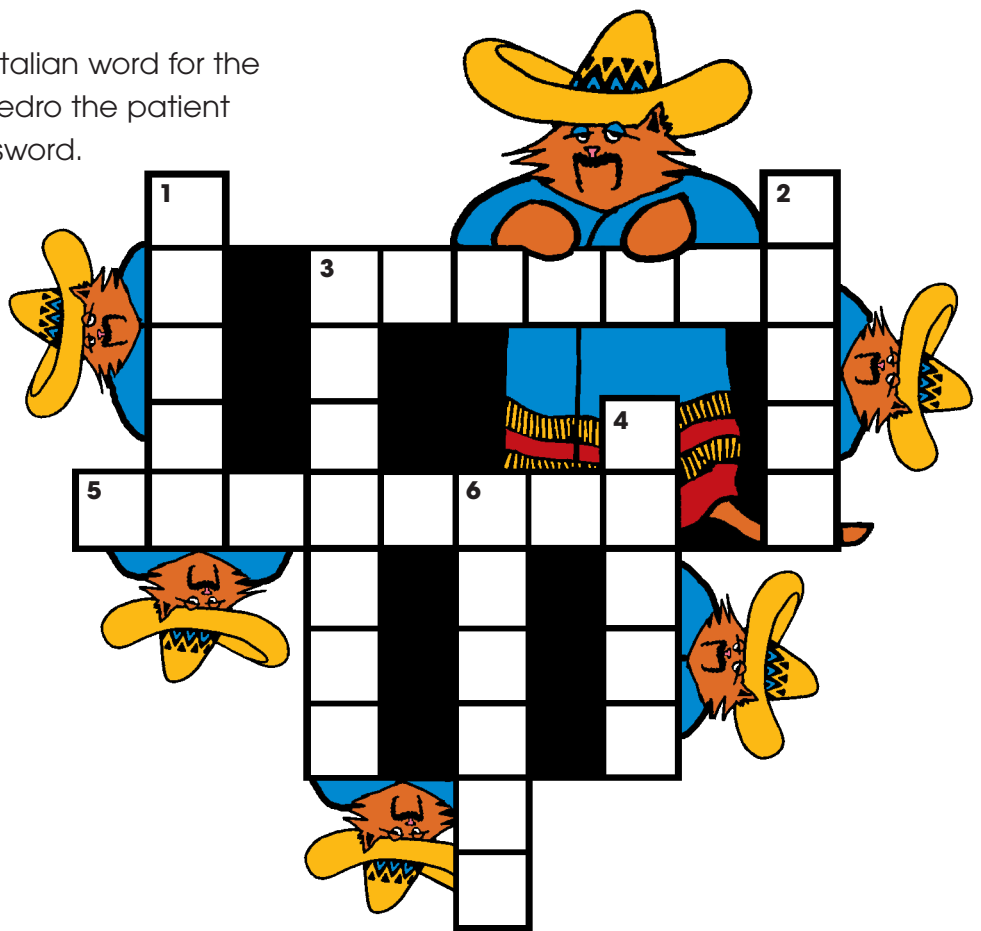
